Public events and information distribution must take place consistent with state criteria and applicable social distancing guidelines. To the extent possible, the Village will continue to add stormwater content in direct mailings to Village residents and will continue to make stormwater information available at community events. The Village will continue to emphasize messages around general stormwater education, pollution prevention, recycling and waste management. The Village plans to provide public education on the amendment of chapter 63 of the plumbing code. The education will include information on the purpose of the amendment, which is to reduce infiltration and inflow into the County's sanitary sewer system by requiring inspection, testing, repair, replacement and ongoing maintenance of private sewer laterals within the Village.

B. Briefly summarize the observations that indicated the overall effectiveness of this Measurable Goal.

Due to COVID-19 related precautions, many in person public events and meetings where materials distribution would occur were cancelled. However, the Village enhanced its stormwater and pollution prevention communications this year by including new stormwater content in 3 Village newsletters. Educational information related to stormwater and environmental awareness was made available on the Village's website, at the Village Hall and Library, and in the Village newspaper. The Village advertised ongoing/ completed green projects at Hendrickson Park and Cahill Park, good housekeeping BMPs for snow removal/ de-icing for residents, and recycling/ waste management notifications on the Village's website, Facebook page and in newsletters.

The Village plans to continue evaluating the number of catch basins inspected, and parking lots and streets swept annually as an indicator for measuring the overall effectiveness of compliance with MCM 6. The Village will continue to follow the BMPs outlined in the NYSDEC Municipal Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping Assistance Document as necessary.

B. Briefly summarize the observations that indicated the overall effectiveness of this Measurable Goal.

A combined total of approximately 573 tons of sweepings were collected from roads and parking lots, and approximately 30 tons of debris were removed from catch basins. The Village continues to prohibit the use of fertilizers and pesticides on public property. The Village installed approximately 3,440 SF of plantings throughout the Village. The Village routinely maintains shorelines and stream beads in Village parks. In the reporting period, the Village undertook improvement projects at Cahill Park which included restoration of the streambeds.
