- 1- Parents' names and background
- 32- Birthplace, Greenpoint, Brooklyn. Siblings. Father's occupation before and after depression. Move to Valley Stream, July 1934. Relatives in the area.
- 55- Attendance at Franklin Ave. school through 6th grade; then Central.
- 83- Administrators: Mr. Gross and Dr. ^{Stuart} Stewart Junior High School Principal. Double session.
- 89- Graduation in 1941. Took Secretarial Course.
- 107- First house in Valley Stream. Shops and offices in the Village. Lynbrook Movie-Arcade.
- 143- 7th grade--clarinet assigned to her by Dr. Smith but it didn't take Neighbors.
- 158- Holiday memories.
- 173- First jobs in business. Hired as district clerk and various positions in district.
- 220- Staff increased with the building of new schools. Continued as district clerk in addition to clerk and later secretary to the Curriculum Coordinator. Colleagues on staff named.
- 272- Member and President of Rosary Society in Holy Name of Mary R.C. Church. Member of choir and sometimes director of annual shows. Purchase of first car 1953.
- 314- Parties at district.
- 327- Co-workers. Work on budget.
- 370- Memories of high school sports.
- 430- Earlier memories of Valley Stream in Horton Avenue vicinity. Changes in Valley Stream noted.
